Happy New Year...and New MIS Alumni Association!

Alumni passion for school is generally more common with a high school or college alma mater...but at Mary Immaculate School, that alumni passion is growing!

With the addition of the MIS Office of Advancement (which included a Director of Communications position) in September of 2009 came the re-birth of the MIS Alumni Association. The association had originally formed in 2002 under the direction of **Martha Curran Mehl '79**, reaching out to alumni at that time through newsletters, an All Class Reunion event, and an appearance on the school website. However, after the event and a subsequent loss of data through a computer crash, the association lost steam and alumni failed to come forward to spearhead a 50th anniversary event.

Past efforts to find alumni have been hampered by the fact that there are no written or electronic records of students prior to 1980. Family directories and yearbooks were not published between 1959 and 1980 by the school, and class records from these years could not be found at the school nor at the diocesan office. Alumni from within those years have pulled together to identify classmates from memory and from photographs, but few have been found from the early 1970s, and even fewer have been identified from the 1960s.

Since September, attention to reviving the association has focused on creating a fan site on Facebook, corresponding with alumni who have created and are maintaining Facebook groups and rebuilding a database of alumni. **Lisa Gonzales Leos '91**, who is a current MIS parent, has stepped forward to identify and coordinate class reps from each of our 50 graduating classes.

Plans for the MIS Alumni Association include creation of a full leadership committee, maintaining an electronic newsletter to support alumni communications, enhancements to our current alumni web pages, creation of an MIS Moms Club, and parish support of alumni class reunions. Discussions regarding another All Class Reunion event have also taken place, but have been postponed pending identification of leadership committee and more class representatives.

MIS Alumni Tracey Bates Leone '81 to Speak at Heart of Gold Auction

We are proud and excited to announce our speaker at this year's Heart of Gold Auction: **Tracey Bates Leone**, Mary Immaculate Class of 1981, who was the assistant coach of the 2004 gold-medal winning US Olympic Womens Soccer Team.

From the time she was a student at MIS, sports have played a huge part in Tracey's life, with soccer as the sport that has been her life-altering passion. Tracey began competing during 3rd grade with several of her MIS classmates, and continued playing soccer throughout her high school years at Ursuline Academy. She then played for the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill from 1985-89, on their women's soccer team that won the National Championship 3 of those 4 years. Tracey's enthusiasm and dedication to the sport made her a 3-time All American player during those years. She also spent four years as a member of the US Women's National Team (1987-91) which culminated with the Americans winning gold at the 1991 World Championships.

Her professional coaching career took off in 1993, when she accepted a position as Head Coach for Clemson University. From there,



Tracey spent several seasons as a member of the US Women's National Team coaching staff, serving as the head coach of the Under-19 squad from 2000-03. In 2002, the US Under-19 Women's National Team won the first ever youth world championship in Canada. Her life journey then led her to

serve as an assistant coach of the gold medal-winning US Olympic Women's Soccer Team at the 2004 Games in Athens, Greece.

Today, in addition to coaching soccer at Harvard University, Tracey is an Olympic Development Coach on regional level, serving as the Head Coach of the South Region. With over 17 years of coaching experience at both the international and collegiate levels, Tracey's impressive credentials brand her as one of the top mentors in the business.

Tracey's international endeavors and winning spirit make her a perfect addition to our 2010 MIS Heart of Gold Auction's *Windows to the World* celebration!

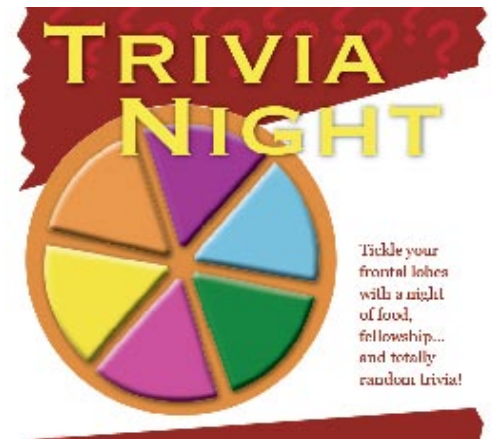
